

Securitas Officer Helps Replace Stolen Bike for an 8-Year-Old

When an 8-year-old boy was beaten & robbed of his bike by three other young boys, Securitas Mobile Guarding officer organized a charity drive to help.

Gregg Marsh, a Securitas USA armed mobile officer, cares about the Stockton, CA community. He works the night shift, responding to alarms at homes and businesses in some of the city's most economically depressed, high-crime areas.

Recently, an eight-year-old boy in Stockton was beaten and robbed of his bike by three other young boys, and the incident streamed live on Instagram. Marsh organized a charity drive for the boy, and was able to give him a new bike, as well as a San Francisco 49ers helmet and a Franklin High School Yellow Jackets t-shirt.

"The donations are just a way of showing him that we care," says Marsh, whose efforts were featured on local TV. "I want him to feel safe here and know that he has the community of Stockton behind him."

It was just the most recent example of Marsh's dedication to the youth of Stockton. He has coached baseball for 18 seasons, and currently is coach at Franklin High School. He was named Stockton Unified School District Coach of the Year in 2007 and 2017, Central California Athletic Association League Coach of the Year in 2012, and received the Stockton "Hero" Award for community service in 2016.
